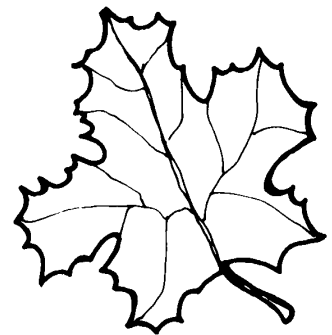

## Instructions

### Glass Eye 2000

Import images into Glass Eye 2000, then print your pattern out any size you want. Large patterns print on several pages. The lines on the separate pages match together perfectly. The lines may not match exactly if you use a copier to copy your new pattern.

The trial version doesn't recognize .gif or .bmp files, so before importing you have to change the image to a .jpg. Open the image with Paint, then File / Save As... a .jpg. To import your .jpg, in Glass Eye click on File / Add Background. The Background Properties box opens. For Image Size, type in the size as you want it to print out. To change the image size later, click on File / Background Properties.

The white space around the image is included in the image size. To get rid of the excess white space, right click on the .jpg filename or thumbnail and Open With.. Picture Manager (included in Windows XP). Crop the image and Save As.. a new name to preserve your original image.

## Instructions

### *Glass Eye 2000 (continued)*

Before printing the pattern, look at it first with Print Preview. You don't want a small pattern printing on two pages. To fix this, click on File / Page Setup. In the Format section, select All On One Page. For a wide pattern, change the Orientation to Landscape.

Some of the free patterns in Glass Eye are only in color. Remove the color to make a black & white pattern. One way is to open the color pattern. On the left side of the screen are buttons for each color used in that particular pattern. The top button is gray. Click on the gray button and the cursor turns into a paint bucket. Click on each pattern piece and the color disappears. Even click on black pattern pieces to get rid of the color, such as in eyes. The printed pattern will then be a line drawing. Click on File / Save As.. to save your new black & white pattern. Keep the original file name and add -bw at the end. By naming it this way, in the list of filenames the color patterns are always next to the corresponding black & white patterns in alpha order.
