Jack O' Lanterns

Pumpkin carving patterns can be used for stained glass, but don't forget that it works the other way, too. Use your stained glass patterns to carve a fantastic pumpkin.

Carving Steps

Pick a pumpkin without nicks or soft spots. A flat side is easier to carve on.

Make a lid by cutting a wide circle around the stem. Scrape the seeds and goo out of the pumpkin. Save the seeds to roast later. Dry the outside surface of the pumpkin.

Tape your paper pattern onto the pumpkin. You may need to notch the paper to make the pattern lay down smoother. To transfer the pattern to the pumpkin, use something to push through the paper into the pumpkin skin. These holes will be the

cutting outline on the pumpkin. Finer details require a smaller poking tool. Items to consider using are an awl, small nail, push pin, or a pumpkin carving tool set. Following the lines on the pattern, push holes into the pumpkin about every 1/8th of an inch. When finished, remove the paper pattern, keeping it nearby to refer to while cutting. Use a pumpkin carving saw to carefully saw along the poked lines. If your holes are difficult to see, a powdered substance such as flour can be used to highlight the holes.

When finished, illuminate your pumpkin with a candle or battery operated light. If using a candle, carve a heat vent hole in the lid. Put the candle in the pumpkin, light the candle, put the lid on, wait a minute, take the lid off and cut the vent hole in the

newly blackened area.
